Dear JOY Members,

The next JOY Town Hall on June 8th will take place after the 10:00 AM service, about 11:30 AM. <u>Come Get the Scoop</u>! So, have a cup of coffee and a snack in the Narthex, and reconvene in the Sanctuary then. The main topic will be the initial recommendations by the **2-5 Year Capital Plan Steering Committee.**

Remembering back to late 2024, when the Property Ministry announced a process to establish a 2–5-year Capital Plan for Joy. Our first step was to determine what improvements, additions, and renovations the congregation desires. A Charette suggestion box was placed in the Narthex for our members to submit their suggestions for improvement. So, on September 19 at 10 AM a Design Charette in Swenson Hall convened for anyone interested in the conceptual planning moving forward. Those that attended formed the Steering Committee. The Charette suggestions, comments, and desires were tabulated and discussed. This discussion led to additional ideas as the initial set of comments for improvements to our campus were considered. The overall most referenced issue was that of more convenient space for fellowship. This was set as the goal to minister to our congregation and any future members our welcoming fellowship may cause to join.

The Steering Committee considered 80 suggestions as improvements to the Church building, Swenson Hall, Parking/Access, and a new separate building were evaluated. This evaluation included the financial capability of our congregation to support any type of construction to cost-effectively reach our goals.

During the upcoming Town Hall, we will, quickly, take the attendees through the process to the development of our Conceptual Plan. Pictures and drawings will be presented to help all envision the conceptual recommendations. A robust Q&A session is anticipated.

Please attend and be part of the process to improve our ability to offer outreach to the community through the worship and fellowship experiences. In Service,


